PRE-CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS - WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15

All Pre-Conference Workshops are held at the Doubletree Hotel; lunch is **not** provided for pre-conference workshops.

Process Science & Troubleshooting for Wastewater Professionals (9:00 AM to 4:00 PM) Earn up to 6.3 Contact Hours

This workshop is designed for laboratory and operations staff to cover wastewater treatment process chemistry and microbiology, focusing on pH, Total Suspended Solids, Settleable Solids, Biochemical Oxygen Demand, Chemical Oxygen Demand, nitrate, nitrite, alkalinity, volatile acids, SVI, SV30, coliform, and other common wastewater/lab parameters from both a laboratory and operations perspective. Basic analytical procedures will be reviewed followed by discussions of what the analytical data means to plant operations and troubleshooting. Case studies will be used to illustrate process problems and how lab and operations staff worked together to solve them.

Salinity in the Central Valley: Issues, Regulations, Perspectives and Case Studies (9:00 AM to 4:00 PM) Earn up to 6.3 Contract Hours

This workshop begins with a session covering the basics of salinity: What salt is (a chemistry lesson); the sources of salt in municipal wastewater; the impacts of salinity on the beneficial uses of recycled water; and the historic impacts of traditional large scale agriculture on our Valley groundwater. We will cover the treatment and removal of salts. We will address the question, "Does reverse osmosis really make sense, and is it sustainable?" You will hear from Valley dischargers who have implemented successful salinity reduction programs.

We will cover salinity/nutrient planning as required by the State's Recycled Water Policy; a review of Central Valley Regional Board salinity permit provisions, responses to those requirements from the State Water Board, and resulting litigation. You will learn about the potential impacts to salinity permitting from the CV Salts Initiative, and the State Water Boards' process to update the south Delta salinity objectives in the Bay-Delta. We will have an update on the CV Salts Initiative.
