May 30, 2024 Event:

Mesmer Low Flow Diversion and Burton Way Median

On Thursday May 30th **Katie Harrel** and **Josette Decalzo** presented on two stormwater projects within the County of Los Angeles. The Mesmer Low Flow Project, located in Culver City, involved installation of a low flow diversion channel in the Ballona Creek channel to reduce pollutant loading to the marina. The diverted water is then sent to the City of Los Angeles sewer system to be treated and reused in the regional one water goals and objectives.



The Burton Way Median Project, located in Beverly Hills, scope involved installation of green streets with aesthetically pleasing bioswale for the local residents. The bioswale collects surface runoff and recharges the upper groundwater table. Both projects were economically funded through multiple sources which included Caltrans, Safe Clean Water Program and other grants to minimize the fiscal impact from the City of Beverly Hills. It was important to see how many different methods of funding can be used to implement best management practices for stormwater mitigation.

June 15, 2024 event


Past President Nothin' But Sand Beach Cleanup
